History/Context

- Community Thriving and Culture Shift
 - Urban areas with density and population issues
 - Communities turning individualistic with technology; never starting conversations with strangers
 - Future Context: Water pollution; Enbridge/keystone pipeline threatens MN great lakes aquifer; Global Warming; Population Issues; Bees are dying
 - 1/3 of citizens oppose everything; 1/3 are in favor of most things; 1/3 are fence-sitters and will listen
 - Oppression, gentrification, reparations for hurt; the cultures relevant to the land
 - From: Reductionist non-human world view
 - Negative: systematic marginalization; reign of global psycho capitalism; stolen land/colonization; legacies of wealth; racism - Positive: Credit-unions; labor justice; mutual aid societies; cooperative housing; black and other minority cooperative history
 - We look at successful projects and learn from them. Look at unsuccessful places and understand why they don't work for people
 - History Lessons: No more Genocide; No slavery; No exploitation! No displacement of families; The planet and Nature are valid on their own... we are part of that; meant to share and enjoy!
 - Be the change you want to see in the world. - Ghandi
 - historically, humans have lived in community-dependent on one another
- Coops
 - We should study examples from the past including Mondragon in Spain & cooperative experiments in this country
 - Coops have been a tool of economic empowerment; cooperative living has been practiced by our ancestors -> we all do better when working together. Coops!
 - 1960's Coop movement; Charles Eisenstien - socio economics - "Inter Being" - socialism is OLD paradigm
 - Cooperative development: abundant opportunities for people to be able to meet their needs (food, material, community, work) through cooperatives; people's work, housing, consumption, etc. being interdependent + based in relationships, community
- Community Development
 - The way our infrastructure is historically set up

- Healthy happiness
- Intentional communities have been practiced by many of our ancestors - kilbutts, hunter gatherer societies/ what the presenter Louis was talking about in Southside Chicago
- success to me is waking up and not worrying
- reducing crime based on the employment rate of our coop + reduced flooding, beach closings, and storm water pollution
- Total transformation of society to one of cooperation, collectivity, and democracy
- Love is the Guide. Integration - Whole systems make visible the invisible; Evolution and Freedom to be sustainable and Just World for the People & Planet
- I want to see people enjoying what they know & what is new
- Have general agreement on process of thinking about change
- Optimized energizing perceptions and experiences. Regenerative
- Everyone has a safe, healthy, “green,” energy efficient place to live, which is beautiful! This housing would be cooperatively owned. The ownership piece would provide stability, and enhance community pride.
- Re-define ‘economy,’ how it is measured and how it is reworded!; Re-define how we relate as community - we should not primarily relate through monetary relationship
- Community Development
 - Want planning commission/city councils to have a scorecard that helps them evaluate the extent to which a project/plan contributes to & fosters community development in a meaningful way
 - Enough Community support to attract significant resources but not trying to get complete consensus
 - A success in cooperative development would be a ton of cooperative businesses helping each other out and creating a strong community, allowing community development to thrive and community workers to have high-value jobs
 - Success for zoning would make mixed-use developments dominant and be an easy alternative to current building organization
 - I want to be a voice in the green infrastructure movement/renewable energy able best utilize my skills to better my community
 - Having a comprehensive set of policies that reflect a real vision of community justice and cement a criteria way of physical development in the structure of cities’ government. Make it nearly impossible to continue doing terrible development
 - Zoning policies would support the kind of built environment that neighbors wish for and want to be a part of
 - City ordinances would allow for forum-based design rather than arbitrary math, based on ordinances for sites
 - Creating more housing cooperatives as a model for sustainable community development, an opportunity for the tangible reimagining of the social and economic status quo. New status quo Coops!

- I don't really have any idea of what success looks like for cooperative development BUT MAYBE IT WOULD BE COOL IF: there were cooperative developers; co-ops make new developments from scratch, instead of just inheriting old buildings?
- Coops
 - Start with existing co-ops in the community - meld those with crowdsourcing techniques to fuel initiatives
 - Self financing cooperative movement. Money and resources, including education, are cycled within a new emerging economy that honors people and planet
 - ((interpreted, based on image)): Build cooperatives - - change broader mindset - - more people eager to make change/be proactive
 - I want growth of the cooperative housing movement (Co-op2!) so that we can collectively bring down the alienating visions ingrained in us by capitalism - that we can be more interdependent & considerate of one another and the natural environment as we pursue our goals

- How to translate Community Master Planning into zoning Policy?
- How can separate site developments work together to impact zoning policy in favor of mixed use?
- How can Community Engagement around site redevelopment be more relevant and empowering to people long term?
- How to build a good team before development? - Being intentional about who is in it and what kind of power they have
- How can high-value job creation be tied to site financing?
- How to support Cooperative businesses in community development
- Language
 - Defining community and community development?
 - Emotional Language
 - How to talk about comm dev in a way that is inspiring and grounded in the practical
 - How do we make our built structures yummy and irresistible?
 - How to talk about Whole Systems lens - "Ecology" and "social economics"
- Community + Developer
 - Accountability for Developers?
 - How do we ensure community ownership?
 - How can community site development be creatively financed so that the vision is not compromised by the developer?
 - How can the community BE the developer?

1. Working Well
 - All understand what the coop does and why

 - housing coop
 - tool for social change

2. Not Working

1. Working Well
 - good policies with amenities and what you're doing
 - hands on and together
 - financially supporting what you support
2. Not Working
 - not enough communication
 - not enough effort to follow through with comprehensive plan by city or officials
 - public is not apart of decisions
3. Major Challenge/Opportunity for Growth
 - Challenges
 - moving from idea to action
 - identifying true weight of desire
 - Growth

- making project accessible to anyone
- plan has a lot more that could be built onto it
